The house sleeps up to 8 guests across three bedrooms and is thoughtfully stocked with everything you need for a seamless stay — from beach gear to board games, a fully equipped kitchen to a 75" smart TV. Gather around the propane fire table after a day at the beach, grill dinner on the private patio, play lawn games in the private backyard, or simply sit on the porch and watch the light change over the meadows of the Preserve.

Watch Hill & Westerly, Rhode Island

Victorian Grandeur Meets Unhurried Seaside Charm

Watch Hill is one of New England's most coveted and quietly glamorous destinations — a Victorian-era coastal village perched at the very southwestern tip of Rhode Island, where Little Narragansett Bay meets the open Atlantic. The village draws visitors for its iconic Flying Horse Carousel (the oldest continuously operating carousel in America), its boutique shopping, the sweeping beaches at its feet, and the legendary Ocean House hotel — one of only a handful of Forbes Five-Star hotels in New England. Despite its prestige, Watch Hill retains an unhurried, community-centered feel that has made it beloved across generations.

The broader town of Westerly, incorporated on May 13, 1669, is one of Rhode Island's oldest communities. The land was originally home to the Narragansett people, who called it Misquamicut — a name that lives on in its beloved beach community.

Westerly's most distinctive legacy is its world-renowned Westerly granite — a uniquely dense, fine-grained stone quarried here beginning in the 1870s and used in monuments, memorials, and public buildings across the United States. Skilled Italian stone-cutters came to Westerly, and their cultural imprint remains visible in the town's architecture and community character today.

In 2002, the National Trust for Historic Preservation named Westerly one of the 12 Most Distinctive Destinations in the United States. Today it is a thriving four-season coastal community anchored by a charming downtown, a lively arts scene, world-class beaches, and a farm-to-table dining culture that has made it a destination in its own right.

Avondale Farm Preserve

A Natural Treasure Right at Your Doorstep

One of Salt House's most extraordinary features is what lies just beyond the backyard: the Avondale Farm Preserve, a protected open space maintained in perpetuity by the Westerly Land Trust. This tranquil landscape of open meadows, ancient stone walls, and rolling farmland offers a rare natural backdrop that sets Salt House apart from any ordinary beach rental.

Whether you're setting off on a quiet morning walk before the beach, exploring the fields with children, spotting birds during migration, or simply enjoying the serenity of a protected natural landscape right next door — the Preserve adds a special dimension to every stay.

What to Expect

- Walking trails through open meadows and historic farmland — just steps from the back gate
- A 0.6-mile paved loop — smooth enough for strollers and wheelchairs; 1.6 miles of trail total
- Fields restored to native New England meadow wildflowers and warm-season grasses
- Views of the salt marsh and the Pawcatuck River from South Avondale Road
- A premier spot for birdwatching and butterfly watching — especially during spring and fall migration
- Ancient stone walls and the quiet character of a working New England farm landscape
- Dogs welcome on leash (please clean up)
- No restrooms on-site — plan accordingly

 Birdwatcher's Note: The Avondale Farm Preserve is one of the finest birding spots in southern Rhode Island. Visit on a calm morning in May or September for peak migration activity — warblers, sparrows, raptors, and shorebirds all pass through. Bring binoculars. The Westerly Land Trust website (westerlylandtrust.org) has trail maps and seasonal wildlife guides.

Your Guide to the Finest Shores Near Watch Hill

Getting to the Beach

Salt House does not include a transferable beach parking pass, but getting to the water is straightforward — every nearby beach accepts daily payment, and several are free to walk into. Below is everything you need to know, beach by beach.

Watch Hill Beach

151 Bay Street, Watch Hill, RI • (401) 348-6540 • merrygoroundbeach.com

The closest and most iconic beach to Salt House, tucked into the heart of Watch Hill village right next to the Flying Horse Carousel. Admission is \$17/adult, \$9/junior (ages 3–17), free under 2. Managed by the Watch Hill Fire District. Lifeguards on duty until 6 PM. Chair and umbrella rentals available. No changing rooms or showers at the beach.

Parking — Plan Ahead

⚠️ Parking and beach admission are two separate charges. Dedicated beach parking passes are reserved for seasonal bathhouse renters only. Day visitors use the general village lots described below.

1. Best option — reserve in advance:

Book a guaranteed parking spot online at watchhillparking.com (Watch Hill Parking Lot, 44 Bay St). Opens at 9 AM. Essential on summer weekends — lots fill by mid-morning on peak days in July and August.

2. Walk-up option — Larkin Lot:

Directly across from the beach. Rates: \$7.50 per half hour, \$50 daily maximum. Free after 4:30 PM — a great strategy for an afternoon visit. No entry after 7:30 PM.

3. Beach admission:

Pay separately at the ticket booth at 151 Bay St upon arrival — \$17/adult, \$9/junior. No advance purchase required.

⚠️ Parking enforcement is strict. Yellow-lined spots and resident-only areas carry a \$150 fine. When in doubt, use the Larkin Lot or pre-reserve online at watchhillparking.com — it's worth it.

East Beach < 5 min drive • Free

A pristine 3-mile barrier beach stretching east from the Watch Hill Lighthouse. Free walk-in access from street-end entrances on Bluff Ave, Everett Ave, and Manatuck Ave. No lifeguards — pack-in, pack-out. One of the least crowded and most beautiful stretches of sand in all of Rhode Island.

👍 *This is the local's beach. If Watch Hill Beach parking feels complicated on a weekend, come here instead — free, gorgeous, and far quieter.*

Napatree Point Conservation Area 10 min drive • Free

Free foot access from the harbor seawall at the southwest end of Bay Street. This 80+ acre conservation area stretches out as a narrow barrier spit, with ocean on both sides. Walk to the very end for breathtaking 360° views. A Globally Important Bird Area.

👍 *Stay on designated paths May–August to protect ground-nesting birds.*

Misquamicut State Beach 10 min drive • \$20 weekday • \$30 weekend

Rhode Island's most popular public beach — over half a mile of wide open Atlantic beachfront with full facilities, concession stands, lifeguards, showers, and restrooms. Adjacent Atlantic Beach Park features a 1921 carousel, bumper cars, arcade, and mini golf.

👍 *Arrive before 9 AM on summer weekends — the lot fills completely by mid-morning.*

Weekapaug Beach 10 min drive • Limited free parking

A quieter, more secluded beach beloved by locals, set along a beautiful coastal breachway. Ideal for a peaceful morning walk or a tranquil afternoon swim away from the summer crowds.

👍 *This is the locals' quiet alternative. Arrive early to find street parking.*

Sandy Point Island 15 min drive + kayak/boat • Free

A pristine, uninhabited barrier island in Little Narragansett Bay accessible only by water. Bring a kayak from Watch Hill Outfitters or join a guided tour for a secluded sandy escape with stunning bay views.

👍 *Watch Hill Outfitters can set you up with a kayak rental for the crossing.*

💡 **Local Timing Tip:** Arrive before 9 AM on summer weekends — Watch Hill and Misquamicut fill completely by mid-morning on peak days in July and August. If you prefer a quieter alternative, East Beach offers free walk-in access with a beautiful 3-mile stretch of sand and lesser crowds. It's our personal favorite.

Shore Fishing, Shellfishing & Charter Trips from Watch Hill

Fishing & Shellfishing

Watch Hill sits at the mouth of Little Narragansett Bay, surrounded by some of the finest inshore fishing and shellfishing waters in southern New England. Whether you're a seasoned angler or picking up a rod for the first time, this is exceptional water.

Shore & Inshore Fishing

Watch Hill Point is one of the premier surf fishing spots in southern New England. The reef complex just off the lighthouse — Watch Hill Reef, Sugar Reef, and Catumb Rocks — creates powerful tidal rips that concentrate baitfish and draw in trophy gamefish throughout the season. This is legendary striped bass territory.

Napatree Point is another outstanding spring spot where striped bass stack up to chase herring and alewives moving into the bay. When squid move onto the reef in early summer, bluefish flood the entire area.

Best conditions: Rising tide with a south or southwest wind. First light, last light, and after dark produce the biggest bass — eels and metal-lip swimmers are the go-to lures after sunset.

Shellfishing in Little Narragansett Bay

The waters right outside Watch Hill are a designated Shellfish Management Area — a rich estuary where guests can harvest their own dinner straight from the bay. Head out just before low tide with a clam rake and a bucket. All harvest is for personal use only.

What you'll find: Quahogs (Rhode Island's state shellfish) are the primary target, but you may also encounter soft-shell clams, mussels, oysters, and bay scallops when in season.

⚠ Always check before you go. Little Narragansett Bay is conditionally approved and subject to water quality closures after heavy rain. Call the RI Shellfish Closure Hotline: 401-222-2900 (24 hrs/day) before heading out. No license required for RI residents; non-residents need a 14-day shellfishing permit (\$11).

Both charters below launch from Frank Hall Boat Yard in Avondale — Salt House's own neighborhood — just minutes away.

Born and raised in Watch Hill, Captain Ben offers the most local light-tackle and fly fishing experience on the water. His 23' Pathfinder departs from Frank Hall Boat Yard in Avondale for half-day, morning, afternoon, and night eel trips targeting the Watch Hill Reef complex. No fishing license required — you're covered under the charter.

Frank Hall Boat Yard in Avondale — just minutes from Salt House — is the local working boatyard and launch site used by both Watch Hill Charters and Fish Trap Sportfishing. If you're trailering your own boat, this is your spot.

Attractions, Activities & Day Trips from Salt House

Local Attractions

Watch Hill, Westerly & Beyond

Flying Horse Carousel < 2 min drive — Bay Street, Watch Hill

Dating to approximately 1876, the Flying Horse Carousel is the oldest continuously operating free-flying carousel in the United States — a National Historic Landmark. Twenty hand-carved wooden horses are suspended by chains from a central canopy. Children under 12 may ride. Operates June through Labor Day.

Watch Hill Lighthouse & Museum < 5 min drive — Lighthouse Road, Watch Hill

Guiding mariners since 1807 — one of the oldest lighthouses in Rhode Island. The current tower (1856) stands at the very tip of the Watch Hill peninsula with sweeping views of Block Island Sound, Little Narragansett Bay, and the open Atlantic.

Atlantic Beach Park 10 min drive — Atlantic Avenue, Misquamicut

A historic 1921 seaside amusement strip next to Misquamicut Beach. Features a restored carousel, bumper cars, arcade, mini golf, and a classic beachside bar. Dusty's Dairy Bar on-site. Great for families.

Wilcox Park & Downtown Westerly 5 min drive — 44 High Street, Westerly

A beautifully designed public park and arboretum gifted to the town in 1898, designed by Warren H. Manning (a former associate of Frederick Law Olmsted). Outdoor concerts on summer evenings. Surrounding High Street features the Savoy Bookshop & Cafe, Martin House Books, galleries, and boutiques.

Watch Hill Outfitters — Kayaking & Water Sports 157 Main Street, Westerly, RI

Kayak and paddleboard rentals for exploring Little Narragansett Bay and the calm tidal waterways around Watch Hill. Ideal for reaching Sandy Point Island or for a leisurely paddle around the bay.

Day Trips

Within an Hour of Salt House

Block Island, Rhode Island ~45 min + ferry from Point Judith

Rhode Island's magical offshore island — dramatic 200-foot bluffs, pristine beaches, historic lighthouses, meandering country lanes, and a charming village with excellent seafood dining. The Block Island Ferry from Point Judith runs about 55 minutes (traditional) or 30 minutes (high-speed). One of the finest day trips in all of New England.

👍 *Buy ferry tickets online in advance for summer weekends. Rent a moped or bike on the island.*

Mystic, Connecticut 15–20 min drive

Explore the world-famous Mystic Seaport Museum — the nation's leading maritime museum, with a stunning collection of historic ships and a restored 19th-century seafaring village. The charming downtown has excellent seafood dining and boutique shopping.

👍 *Mystic Seaport is bigger than it looks — plan at least half a day.*

Newport, Rhode Island ~1 hour drive

Rhode Island's crown jewel. Walk the famous Cliff Walk — 3.5 miles of dramatic coastal trail past the Gilded Age mansions of the Vanderbilts and Astors. Tour The Breakers or Marble House. Explore the bustling waterfront and world-class restaurants.

👍 *Go early on summer days — Newport gets crowded. The Cliff Walk is free and the finest coastal walk in RI.*

Providence, Rhode Island ~45 min drive

New England's most underrated city. Federal Hill is one of the finest Italian dining neighborhoods in the entire country. RISD Museum is world-class. WaterFire events are spectacular. A full day in Providence is deeply satisfying.

Safety Features in the Home

Please take a moment to locate these features on your first evening:

Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Installed in every bedroom, hallway outside kitchen, and in the basement by the mechanical room. If an alarm sounds with no visible fire, check the battery and press the reset button. If you cannot silence it, contact the host at (413) 265-1849. A CO detector is installed in the hallway outside all sleeping areas. If a CO detector alarms: evacuate immediately and call 9-1-1. Do not re-enter until emergency services clear the building.

Fire Extinguishers

Located in kitchen closet and bottom of basement stairs. Use the PASS technique: Pull • Aim • Squeeze • Sweep.

Exits

Primary exit: front door. Secondary exit: back door. Third exit: Sliding door to breezeway to back screen door. All exits must remain unobstructed during your stay.

First Aid Kit

Location: Kitchen closet (by back door). Contains bandages, antiseptic wipes, and basic emergency supplies.

Smart Lock

Your unique guest access code is provided in the booking confirmation. The lock will be active for the duration of your reservation only.

Exterior Security Cameras

Salt House has exterior security cameras on the outside of the property for the safety of guests and neighbors. Cameras are exterior only — no interior cameras.

Gas (Propane) — Fire Table & Grill

Must be attended at all times when in use. Turn off propane tanks after each use. If you smell gas indoors: evacuate immediately and call 9-1-1 and National Grid.

In Case of Fire:

1. Alert everyone in the house immediately.
2. Exit via the nearest door.
3. Call 9-1-1 from outside the building.
4. Meet at the street in front of the house by the mailbox as a designated meeting place.
5. Do not re-enter for any reason until emergency services clear the building.

Parties & Events: No parties, events, or large gatherings. Maximum occupancy strictly enforced.

Parking: Free parking on premises. Please use the driveway only.

Patio Use: The fire table and grill must be attended at all times when in use. Turn off propane tanks after every use. Please do NOT bring house throw blankets outside for use on the patio. Please use the designated outdoor blankets located in the sunroom.

Trash & Recycling: Trash pickup (green tote) is every Thursday. Recycling pickup (blue tote) is every other Thursday (Schedule A — blue-shaded weeks on the attached recycling calendar on the following page). Please place totes at the curb by Thursday morning. They are located outside on the side of the garage. On holiday weeks, service may fall on the holiday or the following day. When in doubt, put it out. Please separate recyclables from trash; bags are located under the kitchen sink.

Glass Stovetop: Please clean after each use. Glass cleaner is under the sink for guest use.

Before You Check Out

- Place all used bath and beach towels on the bathroom floor
- Strip the beds that were used of all linens and pillow cases and put on floor; comforters can stay on beds
- Run the dishwasher with any dirty dishes
- Empty all trash containers in each room and bring outside to trash and recycling totes on side of garage
- Turn off all lights throughout the home
- Close and lock all windows and doors before leaving
- Turn off the propane for the fire table and grill; bring all outdoor blankets back into sunroom
- Collect all personal belongings — check all rooms, bathrooms, and the backyard
- Return all games (including shuffle boards) and books to where you initially had found them
- Return the beach cart, umbrella, and chairs to where you found them
